If you look the other way, get distracted, or lose your footing, you could inadvertently make contact with a power line. You might think you have a steady hand, but making a wrong move could be the last thing you do.

Only OSHA-certified line clearance workers are authorized to trim near power lines. So when hiring a tree trimmer to trim near power lines in your yard or on your property, make sure the person you hire is certified to do so. # **NESTING PLATFORM FOR OSPREYS**

Birds will build nests almost anywhere, including high-voltage substations and power line structures. Nests near high voltage areas can be dangerous if sticks or other debris make contact between power line phases.



Crews installed a special nesting platform at our Montello substation for ospreys. The platform was supplied by American Transmission Company (ATC), our transmission service provider. Ospreys tend to build nests near utility poles and equipment because they are tall structures and provide a sturdy foundation for their nest. As a part of ACEC's environmental efforts, crews provided a safe area for ospreys to call home.


